
On Tuesday, November 26, 2019, Torry and Joyce delivered the pipe Organ.

DOROTHY GORE BEASTON



January 7, 2011 she woke as always in the middle of the night to stoke the fire, she smelled smoke! She tried to use the telephone but her fingers would not cooperate. She crawled on her hand and knees to the back door, she was 85 years of age. She made it to the neighbors to call the fire department. The fire engine could not get there as a tree had fallen across the road somewhere on Dutch Canyon Road. The fire destroyed her home where she had raised her children and lived in for sixty plus years. She was not able to save any of her memories.

Dorothy was born in Arkansas October 3, 1925. In Antlers, Oklahoma to William Gore and Betty Morton Gore. She was one of five girls, raised by their mother in a 'Widows colony' in Oklahoma.

Two sisters married two brothers. She married William "Bill" Beaston at the young age of 15, on March 28, 1941. Her sister Nova married Walter Beaston. The brothers and sisters came to Oregon about 1946/47. They both had six children. Dorothy and Bill lived first on Callahan Road, then Heins cabins in Scappoose, and last they settled in their home in Dutch Canyon. Their six children: Bill, Charles, Pattsie Ebert (Paul), John, Laurie

Turner (Jim), Tim (Rita) Beaston. All children attended and finished school in Scappoose.

Dorothy had a doll shop called 'Bea's Little People' on Dutch Canyon Road where she assembled and dressed beautiful porcelain dolls of every sort. She also repaired most other types of dolls. It was an enjoyable business for her.

She also loved to write poetry, and declared her best poems came during the hardest times. That, raising children and quilt making occupied her time. She was an avid quilter. She spent many years at Scappoose Senior Center as a long-standing member of "The Quilters".

In her spare time, you could find her making pies for local restaurants, raising rabbits to sell, also sold eggs and cream, canned and baby sat, neighborhood children. She had 50 or more blueberry bushes that she picked and sold for many years. A remarkable lady she was. She always said "Idol hands are the devils play-thing.

Dorothy continued to live on the farm independently, until she broke her hip and became bed ridden. She passed September 10, 2014, at her home in Scappoose. Bill had passed away in 1997.

Widows Colony in Sand Springs, Oklahoma – The Colony was a row of 30 shotgun houses surrounded by shade trees on land near what is now Charles Page High School. It was a gift from oil millionaire Charles Page, whose own mother was widowed when he was a child. He also provided an endowment to operate the colony.

It admitted widows with two children or more and gave families a quart of milk each on Monday if they were seen in church on Sunday. Into the 60's, the colony was still there, widening its eligibility to divorced women. (The Tulsa Tribune, Tulsa, Oklahoma July 16, 1998)


